#### **Accident Insurance Cover**

Muckross Park's personal accident insurance cover is with Allianz. With this policy there is an option for the School to extend the insurance cover from solely that of school activities cover to 24 hour cover. Muckross pays for 24 hour personal accident insurance cover for each pupil, using funding from each family's voluntary contribution.

The definition of 24 hour cover is: The pupil is covered 24 hours a day, for School Activities, social, domestic and leisure activities (including during School holidays). To make a claim parent's need to download a claim form from the Allianz website, fill in the details, then bring the form into the school office – where the school's policy number will be added and the form passed on to the Principal for countersigning.

#### **Subscriptions**

The Parents' Association main source of income is subscriptions from parents and this year 216 families subscribed. This money is used to fund speakers for the Parents' evenings, providing refreshments at various events and producing the winter and summer newsletters. Your subscriptions are important and we look forward to as many of you as possible joining next September. The cost is €30 per family per year.

All funds raised from the cinema night are transferred to the BOM and have been used to fund hockey dug outs and basketball equipment.
